 legatus is indebted to the estate in a larger amount than his share of the balance due on said
 report, it is ordered that the Executor pay out the said balance as follows, to the Widow
 Edith Wills \$2945.25 to Aaron O. Wills \$736.31 to James Wills \$736.31 to
 Thos Wills \$736.31 to Satterton Davis in right of his wife Louisa \$736.31 to Satterton
 Charles in right of his wife Polly \$736.31 to Godwin Parker in right of his wife
 Sally \$736.31 to N. W. Berry in right of his wife Susan \$736.31 and that he
 invest the like sum of \$736.31 in interest bearing stock of the State of Virginia for the
 benefit of Stella Langston an infant grand child of the testator without a guardian,
 and if said Exor. should not be able to pay any of the parties herein directed to be paid as
 aforesaid in consequence of their absence in the lines of the enemy or in the Army of the
 Confederate States, he is directed to invest the sum due to such party or parties in interest
