At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 20th day of July 1863.
 This last Will and Testament of Mary Bradshaw dec^d was this day proved by the oaths of John A Hundley and Margaret Hundley the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of James Hundley the executor therein named who made oath and together with Arrington Gardner and Collin Kitchen his securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of four hundred dollars conditioned according to law, certificate is granted him for granting of probate of the said Will in due form -
