Lastly, I nominate, constitute and appoint James R and Wm A Joyner Executors to this my last Will and testament, in presence of. As Witness my hand and seal this 24th day of September 1864.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 20th day of June 1864
This last Will and testament of Patsy Jackson dec^d was proved by the oaths of John Whitehead and Charles Beale two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Wm A Joyner one of the Executors therein named, who made oath and together with John Whitehead & Mark A James his securities, who justified on oath as to their sufficiency, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form, liberty being reserved to the other executor therein named to be joined in the said probate when he thinks fit.
