In the name of God, Amen. I John R. Woodard of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, being of sound mind and proper disposing memory, do make and constitute this my last Will and Testament, revoking all former ones of whatever date -

Item 1st. I desire that all my just be paid out of my estate -

Item 2^d. I lend to my beloved mother Ann W. Woodard, all of my interest in this estate, as it now stands during her lifetime; at the death of my mother I give my interest in the above named property, to be equally divided between my two brothers Henry P. Woodard and Jefferson J. Woodard -

Item 3^d. I wish my Exor. to be hereafter named, to pay out of my money and bonds two hundred dollars to my Sister Martha A. Woodard. The balance of money if any I wish to be equally divided, between my brothers and Sisters.

Item 4th. I give all the balance of property, which may come into my estate, from whatever source, to my two brothers H. P. and J. J. Woodard - Say one third to Henry and two thirds to Jefferson.

Item 5th. I appoint my brother Jefferson J. Woodard my sole executor, and do not wish him to be required by the Court, to give security for his faithful performance of his duty. Signed with my own hand this 11th day of March 1864, in the presence of
