the said hires shall accumulate in his hands for such of his own children as shall attain
the age of twenty one years -

3d. I appoint the said Isaac Pipkin the Executor of this my last will and give him
the balance of my estate if any -

Given under my hand this 21st day of October 1864, in the presence of W A Mapenbury
and Edwin Daughtry who have signed the same as witnesses in the presence of each other.

In the name of God, Amen. I Elizabeth O'Russel of the County of Southampton
and State of Virginia do hereby publish and make known this my last will and Testament
in manner and form following, that is to say -

Item 1st. After my decease I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out
of my estate by my Executrix herein after named.

Item 2^d. I give and bequeath to my grandson Sylvester F Vick one drop table & toilet
one looking glass -

Item 3^r. I give and bequeath to my grandson Augustus C Vick one shot gun -

Item 4th. I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Rosa C Vick one small trunk
and half a dozen China plates -

Item 5th. I loan all the balance of my estate of every description to my daughter Martha
U Vick during the term of her natural life, and after her decease I give and bequeath the same
(or such part thereof as may then be in existence) to her children to be divided between them in
the same manner as if they had inherited it from their mother according to the laws of the state of
Virginia if it be found necessary to sell any part of my estate I desire that such part thereof should be sold
to W Vick -

I now my said daughter Martha U Vick
revoking and annulling all other former
Witnesses whereof I have hereunto set
my hand in the year of our Lord 1863.
