

This last will and Testament of Wm A Summrell dec^d was proved by the oath of S. B. Kello one of the subscribing witnesses thereto. And at a Court held for the said County on the 16th day of January 1865 the said will was fully proved by the oath of Saml B. Holmes one of the subscribing witnesses thereto; and there being no subscribing witness to the codicil to the said will Saml B Kello & Saml B. Holmes being sworn and examined as witnesses, the Court after hearing the testimony are of opinion that the said codicil, and the signatures thereto are wholly in the hand writing of the said William A Summrell dec^d therefore it is ordered that the said Will and Codicil be recorded as the last will and Testament and codicil thereto of the said Wm A Summrell dec^d And on the motion of Samuel B. Pritlow and Jordan D Pritlow the executors named in the said will who made oaths and solemn affirmations as the law directs and together with Thomas J Pritlow James H Jenkins, John Pritlow and Willis Bradshaw their securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of fifty thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate of the said Will and Codicil in due form.

In the name of God. Amen; I James Harris of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, do think proper to make this writing as and for my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows, Viz.

Item 1st. I give and bequeath unto my son Silman Harris one feather bed & furniture to him and his heirs forever.

Item 2^d. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Harris one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item 3rd. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Deborah C. Harris one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item 4th. I give and bequeath unto my son William Harris the plantation wherein I now live (after paying three hundred to my Daughters (namely, Mary Harris, Deborah C. Harris and Elizabeth Ann Bradshaw to be equally divided among them), also one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto Jane Joyner who has lived in my house a long time fifty dollars provided she remains single at my death.

It is my wish that all my estate not before named be sold and after paying my just debts be equally divided between my daughters (namely, Mary Harris, Deborah C. Harris and Elizabeth Ann Bradshaw or their heirs.

Lastly. I do hereby nominate and appoint ^{each of which} my son Joseph Harris and son in law Goodwin Bradshaw my whole and sole Executors to this my last will and Testament, revoking all other will or wills heretofore made by me at any time.
