do make and ordain this as my last Will and Testament.

After my death I give and bequeath to my wife Louisa Burges, the use and benefit of all the estate belonging to me - the power to dispose of any portion thereof, as she may think for her interest and the interest of our children, desiring that after her death it may go, that is such estate as she may leave, may go to the benefit of our dear children who may then be living -
In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this March 17th 1864.

May 30th 1863. That there may be no misunderstanding in respect to the nature of the foregoing bequest, I here distinctly state that I desire all of my property in the hands of my wife, at her death, to be divided among her children, that is to say in possession or held by this bequest, or otherwise, my wife Louisa Burges formerly Louisa Wellons.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 18th day of September 1865

This writing bearing date the 17th March 1864 purporting to be the last Will and Testament of A. S. H. Burges dec^d together with a codicil thereto bearing date the 30th May 1863 was this day produced to the Court and there being no subscribing witnesses thereto, James B. Urquhart being sworn & examined as a witness, the Court after hearing the testimony are of opinion that the said writing bearing date the 17th March 1864 and the signature thereto and the codicil bearing date the 30th May 1863 and the signature thereto are wholly in the hand writing of the said A. S. H. Burges dec^d therefore it is ordered that the said writings be recorded as the last Will and Testament and codicil thereto of the said A. S. H. Burges dec^d and on the motion of Richard W. Burges (no executor being named in the said Will or Codicil thereto) who made oath and together with Samuel B. Kelle and Mr. D. Butler his securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned according to law. Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of Administration with the will and Codicil annexed in due form.

In the name of God, Amen, I Louisa E. Bryant of the County of Southampton being of sound & disposing mind and body do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following, to wit.

1st I will that at a suitable time after my death that my Executor who I shall hereafter name shall examine my papers and get all the bonds that is found due to my estate and pay all my just debts out of said bonds and after paying just debts & other expenses that may accrue by the execution of this my last Will that my Executor shall keep the balance of the bonds that is due to my estate until the death of my sister Sarah J. Barrett and pay annually the simple interest on all the bonds that is due to my estate to my said sister Sarah J. Barrett during her natural life. I also leave to my sister Sarah J. Barrett during her natural life my plantation and negro girl Caroline, and if there should be an increase from my negro girl Caroline during the natural life of my sister
