 to be recorded.

In the name of God, Amen. I William E Gay, of the County of Southampton  
 and State of Virginia, do make and constitute this writing to be my last Will and Testament,  
 in manner and form following to wit, namely.

Item 1<sup>st</sup>. After my just debts are paid I leave the balance of my estate in the hands of  
 my beloved wife Laura Ann Gay as long as she the said Laura Ann Gay lives my  
widow. If she marries she is to have one third of my Estate during her life and the  
 balance of my estate I leave to be equally divided between my lawful heirs.

Item 2<sup>d</sup>. In the event my wife Laura Ann Gay never marries she is to keep my estate till  
 as long as she lives and raise the children and at her death my estate is to be equally divided  
 among my lawful heirs.

Item 3<sup>r</sup>. It is my desire that my negroes shall not be sold. I wish them <sup>to be</sup> divided among my  
 heirs as aforesaid -

Item 4<sup>t</sup>. If my wife should become dissatisfied where she now lives I leave her the <sup>privilege</sup>  
 of selling any part of my estate to buy her a farm and that farm to go to my heirs at her death  
 or marriage to them and their heirs forever.

Item 5<sup>th</sup>. I give my wife the privilege of giving off to my children as they become twenty-one  
 years of age or if they should marry before that time such property as she may think proper  
 by calling two men of good judgment to value the said property and that amount to be deducted  
 from their proportionable part of the legacy.

Item 6<sup>th</sup>. I nominate and constitute my Wife Laura Ann Gay my sole Executor to  
 this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal  
 with the power of Sell any negro that may become unmanageable by her - This 14<sup>th</sup>  
 day of December 1854.
