of August 1866. This last Will and Testament of Eliya
Harris dec'd. Was proved by the solemn affirmation of

and on the Motion of William H. Harris the Executor
therein named, who made solemn affirmation and
together with Zachariah Doyel and Josephus Turner,
his Securitios, (who justified in solemn form as
to their Sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged
g'd a bond in the penalty of One thousand
dollars Conditioned as the Law requires, which
bond having Stamps of the internal revenue of
the United States of the amount of One dollar,
is ordered to be Recorded. Certificate is granted
the Said W^m H. Harris for obtaining Probate
of the Said Will in due form, Stamps of the
Internal Revenue of the United States being
affixed hereto.
