1st All my site title and Interest in the tract of Land my Mother lives on I give to my half Brother and three half Sisters that is Matthew Jeyner, Amy Jeyner, Amelia Jeyner & Elizabeth Jeyner, my wish is that said land shall remain as it is until my half Sister Elizabeth Jeyner becomes of age and then for it to be divided equally between them.

2nd My gun I give to my half Brother Matthew Jeyner.

3rd And lastly the remainder of my Estate, I give to my Mother and her four children by Mr. Jeyner for their marital benefit.
