Ely, Martha A. Darden and Grand-daughter Almida E. B. Jones, should my Grand-daughter have a living heir, lawfully begotten of her body, but should she die without leaving a heir as specified. I give that portion of my Estate left to her to my three daughters namely, Catharine Stephenson, Sally A. Ely, Martha A. Darden to be equally divided, it is my wish that the legacy I leave unto my daughter Catharine remaine in my Son William S. Stephenson's hands, to be given her, as she may want or need it. —

Lastly I do nominate and appoint my son William S. Stephenson, whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, revoking all other Wills heretofore made by me; from the Confidence I have in my Executor named I wish the Court to permit him to qualify without requiring any security.
