according to Law. By Consent of parties it is ordered that the said paper
purporting to be the last Will of Robert Prebleton, be admitted to record,
and treated as his last Will and Testament. Which said paper is in
the following words, to wit: "In the Name of God, Amen. I
Robert Prebleton of the County of Southampton, State of Va. being of sound
mind and memory and being convinced of the brevity of life, do make and
Ordain this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others made
by me. I give and bequeath to my dear and loving wife a good
Support to be shared equally by my four sons - and I give and bequeath to her
the whole of the Chamber furniture, also my gold Watch.
Item 2nd: I give and bequeath to my son John the Williford tract of
Land and the Land lying on the Mill Swamp, the whole (the Williford, and
Mill Swamp Lands) making three hundred and forty two acres to him and
his heirs forever. - I desire that he shall make no return of any property
heretofore given by me, or that he has had from me.
Item 3rd: I give and bequeath to my son Robert B. Prebleton, the plan-
tation on which I now reside containing three hundred and fifty acres,
to him and his heirs forever; also I give and bequeath to him the still
Kettle on the farm, also thirty five Cedar barrels, to him and his heirs forever.
Item 4th: I give and bequeath to my son Wm. H. Prebleton, my interest in the
Lands bought of the Bailey family, four hundred and fifty acres, be the same
more or less, to him and his heirs forever.
Item 5th: I give to my sons Robert B. Prebleton and Charles F. Prebleton,
my interest in my Lands in Mecklenburg Co. Va. to be shared equally
to them and their heirs forever.
Item 6th: I give and bequeath to my son Charles F. Prebleton, all of
my farm known as the Quarter tract, Seven hundred and forty three
