He states further that the receipts and disbursements for the year 1865. were in Federal Currency, and as he has no power without the order of the County to ascertain the true value of the above balance, he has found it necessary to state the following separate account bringing the sum of \$9.98 cts. the specie found due the 24th of February 1864, into the last account.
