Item 1st: I give and bequeath to my five children Chespy Luter, Elizabeth Luter, Nancy Luter, Sarah Luter and Elyza Luter, the plantation wherein I now reside to each of them to have and to hold as a home as long as they or any of them may live.

Item 2nd: My will and desire is after my decease that my Executors Sell at public or private Sale Such property as can best be spared to Satisfy all my debts if any, the balance of my Chattel estate I give to my above named children.

Item 3rd: I do hereby Nominat and appoint my friend Alfred P. Stephenson, as my Executor to this my last Will and Testament revoking all other Wills heretofore by me Made, In Testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this 7th day of November, A. D. 1865.
