I give to my Son Augustus Williams One Dollar of my Estate, that and no more. 7th. After my death I wish my Chatted Estate to be sold, and distributed between my Grand Children as follows, Mary Sand Rollings, Ann Williams, Jefferson Williams, Alpins Williams, Francis Williams, Margarette E. Williams, Junius Williams. 8th H. Sand, Geo. W. Sand, and Jeremiah Sand. 8th. After my death, I wish George W. Sand, to build him a house off to himself, for the purpose of cultivating the Land, providing he will do as follows; he is to furnish annually to Martha Williams & Nancy Pitman, Five Hundred pounds Pork, and Five Barrels of good corn, and after furnishing the above mentioned he is to have all he can make. If Geo. Sand should not agree to the above, I wish Harris Turner to get some good man to take it on the same conditions. Extra of what I have given Nancy Pitman and Martha Williams, say the Land, I now give them One Bed and furniture each, I also make and Ordain Harris Turner my Executor to this my last Will and Testament, and John G. Kelle as assisting Executor; and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke, and disannul all and every other former Testaments, Wills, Legacies, bequests and Executors by me in any way before named, Willed and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this day of February in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred and Sixty Eight. Signed in presence of

Richard Williams Seal

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 15th day of March 1868. This last Will and Testament of Richard Williams decd. was presented and proved by the Oaths of John G. Kelle, James R. Kelle and R. W. Burges the subscribing Witnesses, and Ordered to be recorded. And on the Motion of Harris Turner, the Executor therein named, who made Oath and together with Yachariah Doyal and John I. Johnson, his Securities, (who justified on Oath as to their Sufficiency,) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One Thousand Dollars, conditioned according to Law, which bond is Ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted the said Harris Turner, for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form. It being declared on Oath that the Estate real and Personal of the said Richard Williams, does not exceed in Value the Sum of One Thousand Dollars.
