To the County Court of Southampton County: Your Commissioner reports, that Samuel S. Winters and John Preston, administrators of Joseph Preston, dec'd. has exhibited before me a statement of all moneys received by the said administrators or with which they had become chargeable or had disbursed during the period embraced in the foregoing accounts, together with the vouchers in support of the disbursements. That he finds a balance of \$6889.669 to be due by the said adminrs. to the said Estate on the 17th day of March 1863, in Confederate Money, with interest on \$5982.679 from that day, and also \$2190.369 in gold or its equivalent in currency with interest from Dec. 19th 1863. That the account is supported by satisfactory vouchers, and that the said adminrs. has given such bond as the law requires, the specialty thereof and the securities thereto, are sufficient in the opinion of the Commissioner. That the said adminrs. was embraced in the list of fiduciaries posted up at the Court door of the Court house of Southampton County on the first day of February last, and now on this day, (ten days having elapsed since the same was thus posted up,) the foregoing accounts is made up and completed.
