 but of Sound Mind and Memory, do make and Ordain this
 to be my last Will and Testament as follows viz: I give and
 bequeath to my friend James Ellis all my Land, together with
 my two Negro Boys (namely), Dennis and Charles, to him and
 his heirs forever; I also give to him the said James Ellis all my
 Stock of horses, cows, and hogs, all my household and kitchen
 furniture, farming utensils &c. together with all Money, bonds,
 and accounts including all and every part and parcel of
 property that I may own or be in possession of at my
 decease, to him and his heirs forever. And further it is
 my Will that he be lawfully buried and pay all my
 just debts and funeral expenses. And lastly, I constitute
 and appoint him the said James Ellis Executor of this my
 last Will and Testament. Signed Sealed and acknowledged
 this eleventh day of February 1851.
