

The Commissioner States Specia^{ly}, at the request of the Executor, that the above account concludes his transactions in Confederate money; that in consequence of the dangers and difficulties occasioned by the Federal forces, the public enemies of the times, the Executor was not able after the Summer of 1863, to visit the farm in question, until September 1865, after the close of the war, at which time on a settlement with Saml. Kincaid, his agent to manage and take care of the property in his absence, he found a balance of \$503.24 in Confederate money in the hands of his agent, derived from the profits of the farm subsequent to the Summer of 1863, and previous to the end of the war, including the sum of \$500.00 in Confederate money left in his hands in 1863. The Executor considers himself bound to receive the amt from his agent in the same currency received by him, and has the amt now in his hands. Subsequently to the Summer of 1863, nearly everything on the farm was taken or destroyed by the Federal Army, all the stock of horses, cattle, sheep and hogs were destroyed, except the exception of one cow and eight sheep, also the small quantity of household furniture reserved at the sale, for the convenience of the Executor on his visits to the farm, saw two beds and bedsteads and a few other articles in a wretched and wretched condition; nearly all the fencing on the farm and all the grass in the Meadows were destroyed, and the Executor has been compelled to incur considerable expense to replace them. (The following account shows the Executor's transactions since the close of the war.)
