I, L. F. Vargus, of the County of Southampton Virginia, being of Sound & disposing mind and memory, do make, Ordain & publish this to be my last Will & Testament. It is my Will and desire that my Executors hereinafter named shall settle all my fiduciary transactions as soon after my decease, as possible. Knowing that delay in such matters will lead to confusion and loss, I give & devise to my wife Eliza B. Vargus, for and during her natural life, the Mansion house in which I now reside, together with the Garden therein attached, such necessary out houses as she may require for the use of herself & Servants, & also a full Supply of firewood to be obtained from the tract of Land adjacent to the said dwelling house, which said tract of Land is given and devised to my son Whitwell H. Vargus, as will be herein more particularly set forth & described. I give & devise to my wife, for & during her natural life, the tract of Land, lying in the County of Northampton, North Carolina, adjoining her farm known as "the Occurrence", it being the same tract of Land conveyed to me by Dr. W. E. P. by Deed now of record in the Clerk's Office of Northampton County, North Carolina, to which due reference is hereby made for a more particular description. I give & bequeath to my Wife, for and during her natural life, the use of all my horses, Mules, Cattle, Sheep, Hogs & Stock of every description, also all the plantation tools & implements remaining, at the time of my decease, on the said plantation, in North Carolina, known as "the Occurrence". I give and bequeath to my Wife, one years full supply of provisions for herself, all her hired servants in Virginia & North Carolina, her Carriage horses, & the Stock of horses, Mules, Cattle, Sheep, Hogs &c. as hereinbefore mentioned. I give & bequeath, to my wife absolutely and for her sole use and benefit, my Carriage & Carriage horses, & all my household & kitchen furniture of every kind & description whatsoever. I give & bequeath, to my Daughter M. A. H. Tillard, wife of J. F. Tillard, the Sum of Three Thousand five hundred dollars, the same to include the Sum of Five hundred dollars in full Sales price & payment of the legacy left her by her Grandmother Mrs. R. Hill. I give & bequeath to my Daughter M. S. Sand, wife of A. S. Sand, the Sum of Three Thousand five hundred dollars, the same to include the Sum of Five hundred dollars.
