 make & declare this to be my last Will & Testament, revoking all others & former Wills.
 1st I leave to my wife all of my real & personal Estate which she retains in her
 or during her Natural life, with the privilege of selling any part or parts of her
 Chattel Estate that may be necessary for the support of herself & children.
 In the event however of her Marriage or after her death, then I wish all of my personal
 and Chattel Estate to be equally divided between all of my children then living
 in such manner & form as they themselves may decide upon.
 2nd After the death of my wife I wish my Land to be equally divided between
 my sons then living in such manner & form as they may decide upon.
 3rd I prefer that there should be no qualification on my Estate. Should it
 however be necessary for the collection of claims &c. then & in that event I desire
 the Court to permit her to qualify without exacting any Security whatever.
