

I Sally Pope of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, do make and Ordain
 this my last Will and Testament in the manner and form following, Viz.,
 First, I wish and my will is that my Executors who I shall hereafter name, will pay
 all my debts and funeral expenses, out of my Estate,
 Second, I give to Rebecca A. Stillman, my Bureau, to her and her heirs forever.
 Third, I give to Caroline R. Pope, the wife of Rev. E. Pope, my Bed and furniture
 to her and her heirs forever.
 Fourth, I give to Phebe C. Pope, Six Silver Table Spoons marked S. S. P. and
 I give to Joseph B. Pope, Six Silver Tea Spoons marked S. P. to them
 and their heirs.
 Fifth, I give the balance of my Estate of every kind whatsoever to Lewis
 M. Barkham, widow of John Barkham decd. Caroline P. Tardner,
 wife of Richard J. Tardner and Mariah J. Barkham, wife of
 C. F. Barkham, to be equally divided between them, to them and
 their heirs forever.
 Lastly, I hereby appoint my son Rev. E. Pope, Executor, and wish him
 not to be required to give Security to the Court for same.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton, at the Court House thereof, on Monday
 the 21st day of March A.D. 1848. (This last will and Testament of Sally
 Pope decd. was this day proved by the Oaths of William J. Barkham and Charles E. Knight
 the subscribing witnesses thereof and ordered to be recorded. And Rev. E. Pope, the Executor
 therein named, refused to take upon himself the burden of the Executors Oath, and
 thereupon at the Motion of C. F. Barkham, who made Oath as the law directs, and
 together with Richard J. Tardner and R. E. Tardner, his Securities, (who justified
 on Oath as to their Sufficiency,) entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the
 penalty of two thousand dollars, (conditioned according to law, which Bond
 is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted him the said C. F. Barkham
 for obtaining letters of administration on the Estate of the said Sally Pope
 decd. with her will annexed in due form. It being sworn that the Estate
 for and in respect to which such letters of administration applied for does
 not exceed in value the sum of two thousand dollars.)
