

Know all men by these presents that I Robert G. Nibbitt of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, being of Sound mind and Memory, do make and constitute this my last will and Testament, revoking all others by me made, and dispose of my Estate in the following manner, to wit; I leave all my Estate both real and personal to be sold and all my just debts to be paid. I give to my beloved wife two feather Beds and usual Clothing and five hundred dollars out of the proceeds of my Estate, when sold and the money collected, on the condition that my wife Mary A. Nibbitt will give up her interest in my plantation, to her and her heirs forever. I give All the remainder of my Estate to be equally divided between my three Children to wit; my son William, my Daughters Mary Nibbitt and Rosalie Nibbitt to share equally alike to each one and I have made and to be allowed the privilege to duly qualify without giving any Security and to be invested with full power to sell and convey the Plantations whereof I have been together with all the right, title and claim that is incident to them. Given Under my hand and seal as above I have affixed my seal and signed and delivered in the presence of this day of March 1870.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on Monday the 18th day of April A.D. 1870 - This last will and Testament of Robert G. Nibbitt did as this day presented to the Court and proved by the Oaths of John Cook and Joseph Conner, the Subscribing Witnesses and ordered to be recorded. And on the Motion of James G. Jones, the Executor named in said said will, who appeared as the law directs, and entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Two Thousand Dollars, Conditioned as the Law directs, (the will directing that no Security should be required, and the Court requiring none,) which Bond having a Stamp of the Int. Rev. of the U.S. to the amount of one dollar, affixed thereto and duly cancelled, is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted him the said James G. Jones, for obtaining a probate of the said said Will in due form.
