To the County Court of Southampton County, Your Commissioner respectfully reports to the Court that Samuel Miller, administrator of Osdun Vick died testate before him a statement of all moneys received by the said administrator or with which he has become chargeable or has disbursed during the period embraced in the foregoing account, together with the vouchers in support of the disbursements. That the first balance of (\$5238) principal and interest to be due the said Estate by the said administrator on the 23rd day of November 1869. That the said account is supported by satisfactory vouchers, and that the said Administrator was embraced in the list of Administrators posted up at the Court house of Southampton County, on the first day of February last, and from and since day, (ten days having elapsed since the same was posted up,) the foregoing account is made up and completed. Your Commissioner also reports, that he has made up accounts of debts and demands against the said Estate and an account appertaining the fund in the hands of the Administrator amongst the several Creditors.
