

1st; To my three Children my, Catharine Rebecca, John and Margaret
Elyahut, I bequeath equally all of my personal property (with the
exception) of giving to Margaret Elyahut, Five hundred dollars more
than I shall of the other two
3rd; To my daughter Margaret Elyahut, I give, devise and bequeath,
one third portion of my land, to be laid off by duly authorized Com-
missioners, so as to give her, the houses in the Nelsons Field, on the
Fisher Lane. I give her also, the house in the Nelsons Field, on the
West Side Lane, in front of my residence, I don't attach no land to this
house.

4th; To my daughter Catharine Rebecca, I give, devise, and bequeath,
one third portion of my land, to be laid off by duly authorized Commis-
sioners, so as to give her the buildings, in the field known as the
hit field. I give her also the frame house with brick chimney, in
the middle, on the East Side of the lane in front of my residence,
with 2 1/2 Acs attached.

5th; To my son John Whitehead, I give, devise, and bequeath, one third
portion of my land to be laid off by duly authorized Commissioners,
so as to give him my residence and all the other houses attached,
except those mentioned herein above.

6th; I Appoint James M. Corbett, of Southampton County, State of
Virginia, Executor of this my will, and authorize the Court of
my County, not to require of him any Security, when qualifying
as Executor of this my last will.

In witness whereof, I have Signed and Sealed and published and declared
this instrument, as my will at Branchville Twp, Southampton County,
Virginia, on the tenth (10th) day of September 1870.
