Kendrick, who has since died, leaving three infant children, of whom John P. Kendrick their father has qualified as Guardian, Sallie & Tranny, who has since intermarried with F. M. Buford, and Mary Ann Goodwyn, to be equally divided between them. That the Specifics of the parties indebted, occasioned by the late war, resulting in the loss of the property included therein by the Executor for their support and maintenance, involved the Executor to incur the personal responsibility of advancing this fund to the parties, as will be seen by reference to their bound account, with the object and intention on the part of the Executor, to retain the amount and invest the same as directed by the Will, out of the rents and profits of the property now sold and unsold, which the parties have the right to receive, when collected. The Executor took bond from the purchasers, for the deferred payments for the real estate sold bearing interest from date, retaining the title to the property until paid.
