In the Name of God, Amen; I Jeremiah C. Johnson of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, do hereby make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, to wit:

Item 1st. After my decease, I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my Executor herein and after stated out of my Estate.

Item 2nd. I give and bequeath to my beloved Mother two hundred Dollars to her and to her heirs forever, also one bad or calf and three hundred pounds of pork, also three barrels of corn and two small weighing scales to her and to her heirs forever.

Item 3rd. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Judicah C. Johnson all of my Stock of Horses, Cows, Swine, together with Crops of Corn & fodder and farming utensils, also one Buggy and harness two Saddles and bridle, two Sulkies, together with my household and kitchen furnitures together with all my perishable Estate.

Item 4th. I give and bequeath to my said wife all of my money and debts due me at the time of my decease by bond or open accounts, to her and to her heirs forever.

Item 5th. I hereby nominate and appoint my friend Amos M. Bryant Executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all other former Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this

At a Quarterly Term of the County Court of Southampton held at the Court House thereof on Monday the 21st day of August 1861.
This last Will and Testament of Jeremiah C. Johnson decd. was proved by the Oath of Henry M. Britt one of the subscribing witnesses, and Abram Riddicks the other subscribing witness being dead, John M. Beaman and Amos M. Bryant being sworn severally deposing and saying "they are well acquainted with the handwriting of the said Abram Riddicks and verily believe the name of the said Abram Riddicks to the said Will subscribed as a witness is in his proper handwriting of the said Abram Riddicks."
