 and Memory, do declare this writing to be my last Will and Testament.
 Item 1st; I give and direct that my just debts be first paid.
 Item 2nd; It is my Will and last direction that the remainder of my
 property after the payment of my debts and funeral expense, shall remain
 as it now is to and for the use and benefit of my Mother, Jane Jeynes.
 Item 3rd; At the death of my Mother, all of my property not then consumed
 in the use thereof said and Bond of a Hundred and Fifty Dollars hereinafter
 mentioned, shall go to my Sister, Maria A. Jeynes and her heirs forever.
 Item 4th; At the death of my Mother the Bond mentioned in
 (Item Third) against my brother, Elisha Jeynes, to be equally
 divided between my brothers, Martin L. Jeynes and
 Elisha Jeynes, to be held as their property absolutely.
 Item 5th; I bequeath to my brother, Thomas W. Jeynes,
 the Sum of Five Cents and no more.

 the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred
 and Seventy One.
