

In the Name of God, I, William J. Bryant of Southampton County, State of Virginia, being in Sound Mind and Memory do make this my last Will and Testament. First I pay all my just debts, and then I give unto Lucy James Bryant, Patsy Tyler Bryant and Nancy Robinson, widows of John Robinson, the sum and Land where I now live, Situated out and Said in Containing Twenty Acres, more or less, but if either one of them die, then the Land shall go to the living one of the first named, and the last living one of the three named shall have the same and Land named above. Then I give to Sally Bryant, wife of Britton Bryant, five dollars, then to Henry Edna Horrell, the wife of Joseph Horrell five dollars, and then the balance of my Estate to Lucy James Bryant, Patsy Tyler Bryant and Nancy Robinson the widows of John Robinson, to be equally divided between the three last named. And I now appoint Dennis Bryant as my Executor, in my Estate, and I do further being in Sound Memory make this my last Will, and do further incorporate with to duly executed. This the twenty seventh day of October in the thousand eight hundred and seventy two. Witness my hand and Seal.

Item First, After my death, I wish to be buried by the Side of my late wife and a Monument to be erected to the two erected to her Memory.

Item Second, I hereby appoint my brother Wm. W. Cuth of Southampton County Virginia, the Guardian of my Daughter Mary S. Cuth, and direct that she be thoroughly educated.

Item Third, I hereby direct my Daughter Mary S. Cuth to be placed by her Guardian in charge of my Sisters Sarah A. and Mary C. Cuth to have her home with them until she arrives at the age of twenty two years.

Item Fourth, In the event of the death of my brother Wm. W. Cuth before the arrival of my Daughter at the age of twenty two years, I appoint my brother George Cuth to be her Guardian, my daughter is now to be removed by her Guardian from under the Supervision of my Sisters at any time.
