In the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and Seventy two, the twenty first of March I
make my last Will & Testament 1st I leave to my Daughter Rebecca S. Little two
hundred and forty acres of Land lying on Nottoway River called the "Brum Land", and after
her death I give it to her nearest blood relation or heirs, Valued at one thousand
Dollars, which she has to pay to my four sons each two hundred and twenty two
dollars and fifty cents, which will be named in my Will below (these names);
2^d; I give to Jeph S. Corth, my eldest son one hundred and seventy two
acres of Land, Valued at Seven hundred and seventy five dollars, lying on Nottoway
River and Nottoway River called "Ellis Land".

3^d; I give to son Virginia H. Corth one hundred and seventy two acres of Land
joining the said son Jeph's Land, a part of the Ellis tract and a part
of the Bryant's tract, Valued at Seven hundred and seventy five dollars.

4th; I give to my son James D. Corth one hundred and seventy two acres
joining said son Virginia H. Corth's Land Valued at Seven hundred and
seventy five dollars.

5th; The house place containing one hundred and seventy two, more or less, if less,
shall be made equal out of the balance of my Estate, I leave to my Widow
her widowhood life, at her death I give it to Major G. Corth, Valued at
Seven hundred and seventy five dollars.

I give my Widow the 1st Chris Bede I give to each one of my four sons and
Daughter two Bede a piece, those of them that has not got one in their possession;
I also give to my youngest son Major G. Corth my family Bible.
The remaining parts of my Estate to be sold and all of my just debts
paid, then the balance to be equal divided between my Widow, Daughter
and four sons. I leave my Sals to be as soon as convenient at a time
my Credit proving securely in Sight of the Homestead land.
I leave Ellick Storey and William B. Shanks my Executors my Estate to
be sold twelve months after day of Sals, each one of them to take their
property in possession at fourteen years of age, as to be done with as
little expense as properable; This being my Will as witness my hand
and Seal this 1st above date; This is my last Will and desire.
