2nd I wish my land not be sold but for Polly Edwards who has lived with me for several years have the use of it during her entire life at her death I will that it belong to her son Luther B. Edwards to him and his heirs forever.

3rd I give all my Chattel Estate of every name to Polly Edwards to her and his heirs forever. I declare the above to be my last will and Testament revoking all wills heretofore by me made. Given under my hand and seal this 9th day of October 1857.

Davis and verily believes his name to the said Will subscribed as a witness is in the proper hand writing of the said R. I. Davis. Whereupon the said Will is ordered to be recorded.
