In the Name of God Amen. I Joshua Whitney in the parish of
Vottonway and county of Southampton being sick and weak in body but of
perfect & sound mind & memory thank be given to almighty god do make
and ordain this my last will and testament in manner & forme following
first and principally I give and bequeath my soul into the hands of
the almighty god who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a
decent an christian like manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter
named and as for what worldly estate it hath pleased Almighty god to
bless me with I give devise & dispose thereof as followeth

Item I give and bequeath to my son Joshua Whitney all that part of my
land between the cattail branch and the land of Geo Lawrence & Charles
Lawrence and Elisha Ballards Land & Bennett Whitmans land the same
to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Elisha Whitney all that tract of land
and plantation which I purchased of George Brewer in the Isle of White
county and fifty acres of Land more in Southampton county it being part
of the tract of land whereon I now live and Joining of Giles Towners line
and along his line to the cattail branch & then down the run of said
cattail branch to the branch called Lepus more branch & then up the side
branch to the head of it and from thence running a straight line to the
poisson and down the poisson to the first station including fifty acres more
or less within the bounds aforesaid the same to him & his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Giles Whitney all the rest of remainder
part of this tract of land and plantation whereon I now live the same
