hundred and seventy five acres I also give my said the
land I bought of W^m DeLoch & Leonard Orey being about
four hundred & twenty five acres to him and his heirs
forever . . .

I give unto my son Anthony Colthop and his heirs
forever my land and plantation I bought of the Rottonwy
Indians containing four hundred acres of land . . .
