I W^m Pope of Southampton County in Virginia being in
perfect health and disposing mind and memory a calling to mind
the uncertainty of this life and that it is appointed for all
men to die do think proper to make constitute & ordain this my
last will and testament in manner and form following

Item I give devise and bequeath to my daughter Priscilla Pope the
use and profit of all my houses wherein I now live with
as much cleared grounds as she may have occasion to make
use of also the privilege for fencing & fire wood with wood
one half the profits of my orchard for and during her natural
life or till marriage.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my son John Pope my plantation
and all my lands wherein I now live containing 350 acres only
reserving to my daughter as above bequeathed & to my son
W^m Pope a free privilege of what timber he may have occasion
of for his own use out of my plantation. I give unto my son
John and his heirs forever also one handmill & a set of iron
wedges with all my Coopers Tools &c.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my son William Pope all my
shoemakers tools also all my Carpenters tools to him & his
heirs forever.

Item I give devise & bequeath to my daughter Sarah Macey ten
shillings cash to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give devise & bequeath to my daughter Ann Colb
ten shillings cash to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give devise & bequeath to my daughter Mary Weston
