In the name of god I John Robert Carr now being in  
perfect good sense and memory but calling to mind that all  
men must die I make this my last will and in manner  
as followeth Viz.

First I bequeath my soul to god that gave it in the  
name of Jesus Christ and my body to be buried in a  
decent and christian like manner as for what estate it has  
pleased god to endow me with in the following manner  
Viz.

I give and bequeath to my eldest son Robert Carr the  
plantation wherein he now lives and two hundred twenty  
four acres adjoining thereto also one hundred twenty five  
acres of land lying in Southampton County on Parney Bridge  
to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my youngest son John Carr the  
plantation wherein I now live and one hundred fifty  
acres of land belonging thereto also two hundred twenty  
five acres of land lying in Isle of Wight county joining  
that land of my son Robert Carrs on the west side of the  
Cabbins branches from Roberts plantation also twenty five  
acres of land lying on Parney Bridge to him this he is  
forever. In case my son John Carr should die without heir  
lawfully begotten his lands to fall to his four sisters Ann  
Jories Elizabeth Johnson Rebecca Carr and Grace Carr  
to them and their heirs to be equally divided

Item I give and bequeath to my son John Carr one Still Cst  
and Waian reserving that my son Robert Carr shall have  
the use of her to still his own liquor in case my son  
John Carr die without heirs the still to fall to my son  
Robert Carr.

Item I give and bequeath to my eldest daughter Martha Newb-  
twenty shillings.

Item I give to my son John Carr one feather bed & furniture  
corn and calf one two year old heifer some young horse one
