I give unto my son Duen Harris two negro boys named Jamy & Harkey to him and his heirs forever.

Item

I give unto my son Nathan Harris one negro boy named Ben to him and his heirs forever.

Item

I give unto my son John Harris three negroes named Dick, Jany and Will to him & his heirs forever.

Item

I give unto my son John Harris the land & plantation where he now lives to him & his heirs forever.

all the remainder of my estate I leave to be sold and the money to be equally divided between my wife & several children Nowt Thomas, Duen, Nathan, Ann, Martha, & John,
