

Item I give unto my daughter Mourning Browne one negro boy called Charles one cow and calf two ewes one new feather bed with new rugg at forty shillings one pot of new sheets one cloak at twenty shillings price one quilt at one guinea price and Jeweler to the value of twelve and six pence to her heirs forever

Item I give unto my daughter Holland Browne my negro woman called Hannah and one negro girl called Lucy one new feather bed and one new rugg at forty shillings price one pot of new sheets and thirteen pounds current money of Virginia to her and her heirs forever All the rest of my estate of what nature or kind forever or wheresoever it be found I give to be equally divided between my son Jesse Browne my five daughters namely Sarah Noel Mary Allen Martha Allen Mourning Browne and Holland Browne each of them to have an equal part them and their heirs forever

Lastly I do appoint my son Jesse Browne and James Allen to be my whole and sole executors executors of this my last will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this twenty eighth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred sixty & four

At a Court held for the county of Southampton the 11th day of January 1765
