Item I give and bequeath to my loving son Burdell Rose one feather
bed and furniture one chest and iron pot some chairs one frying
pan and the one half of my pewter which said feather bed &
furniture chest iron pot chairs frying pan & pewter I give
and bequeath to my said son and to his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Rose after the death of
my wife the bed and furniture spinning wheel loom box iron, iron
pot, and the one half of my pewter which I lent to my said wife
which said bed wheel loom box iron, iron pot & pewter I give &
bequeath to my said daughter and to her heirs forever

My will and desire is that all the remainder of my estate of
what nature or kind soever or wheresoever found be sold & after
my just debts being paid out of it the remainder to be equally
divided between my son Burdell Rose and my daughter Mary
Rose to them and their heirs forever and I appoint my son
Burdell Rose and Anna Thomas executors hereby revoking all
other wills by me heretofore made and declare this to be my
only last will & testament In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal this fifth day of July 1765
