and bequeath to my said son and to his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Rose after the death of  
my wife the bed and furniture spinning wheel loom box iron  
pot, and the one half of my puster which I left to my said wife  
which said bed wheel loom box iron, iron pot & puster I give &  
bequeath to my said daughter and to her heirs forever

My will and desire is that all the remainder of my estate of  
what nature or kind soever or wheresover found be sold & after  
my just debts being paid out of it the remainder to be equally  
divided between my son Barnell Rose and my daughter Mary  
Rose to them and their heirs forever and I appoint my son  
Barnell Rose and Anna Harris executors hereby revoking all  
other wills by me before me made and declare this to be my  
only last will & testament In witness whereof I have hereunto  
set my hand and affixed my seal this fifth day of July 1765
