In the name of God amen Thomas Westbrook of Southampton

County being sick & weak of body but of sound & perfect memory thanks be to
Almighty God wherefore do make & appoint this to be my last will & testa

ment I commend my soul to almighty God that gave it hoping to receive a joyful
resurrection of the same & my body to be buried at the discretion of my executors
hereafter mentioned & as to what worldly goods it hath pleased God to
bestow on me I dispose of them in the manner following

I Give to my loving wife Hilbera my horse and my mare & one feather
bed and furniture & three cows & calves

I Give to my son Benjamin Westbrook my great gun

I Give to my daughter Helia one cow & yearling

I Give & bequeath to my son Wm Westbrook my plantation which
I now live estimated at seventy two acres be the same more or less within
the bounds following dividing by a line to be run straight from
a tall pine in John Reid line to a pine in Wm Laugm line near a hog
pen that I made to him & his heirs forever

~~I Give to my son Thomas Westbrook~~

I Give to my son Thomas Westbrook the remainder of my land estimated
at seventy two acres & bound by the said line to him & his heirs forever

I Give to my daughter Mary one cow or heifer I Give to my daughter
Calia one heifer I Give to my son Wm a my yearling colt or filly

The remaining part of my estate I leave to the use of my wife & children
to raise & support them on My will & desire is that at my wife's death
the said remainder abovementioned may be divided among my children

I Do appoint James Ramsey my whole & sole executor of this my last
will & testament hereby revoking all other wills formerly by me
made & do ordain this to be my last will I nevertheless whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this twenty sixth day of Oct^r
