given to such child or children (yeing as aforesaid) be equally
divided amongst such of my children as shall survive their
père for ever

And Lastly I do appoint my loving wife Mary Newsum & my friend
James Barham Executors of this my last will & testament hereby rev-
oking all other wills by me heretofore made In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 22nd day of Nov^r 1767.
