In the Name of God amen I Henry Adams of the county of
Southampton being sick & weak of body but praised be God of perfect
sena & memory do make & appoint this my last will & Testament
Imprimis I humbly recommend my soul to God that gave it
and fast by trusting to his gracious acceptation thereof my
body I commit to the earth to be decently interred at the
discretion of my executrix & executor hereafter named
& for what worldly estate it hath pleased God ^{in his goodness} to bestow
upon me with I give & dispose thereof as followeth -

First I give unto my beloved wife one feather bed & bolster one rug
two sheets bedstead & Cord

I then I give & bequeath unto my son Henry Adams the Land &
plantation whereon I now live containing by estimation
two hundred & twenty acres together with one feather bed & bolster
one rug two sheets bedstead & cord to him & his heirs for ever

Also I give unto my son Henry Adams three negroes Lewis Tom &
Gesage to him & his heirs for ever

Wherein I give unto my son Henry Adams one horse called Caul one
mare called Jude & colt called Ruby two ewes one sow & four
sheep one chest two dishes three plates one stool one Gun one
sword & six chairs & one table

I then I lend the use of my negroe wench called Peg to my beloved wife
& after her death I give the said wench unto my son Henry
Adams & his heirs for ever

I then I give unto my beloved wife one horse & saddle ^{which} & one stool
four dishes eight plates two ewes & one Cow
