containing one hundred & twenty acres more or less to him
& his heirs for ever - I then I give to my son Joseph two ne-
groes Jack & Ron to him & his heirs for ever & if this my
son should die without heir then these negroes to return to
my estate I then I give & bequeath to my son John the plantation
whereon I now live containing one hundred & twenty acres more
or less to him & his heirs for ever - I then I give & bequeath to
my son John one negro girl named Hannah to him & his
heirs for ever & if this my son should die without heir
then the said negro to return to my estate - I then after
my just debts are paid then I lend my whole estate to
my wife during her natural life & after her death to be
equally divided between my five children three sons & two
daughters Henry Joseph John Jane & Sarah - I then if
either of my three sons die without heir so my two
surviving sons to divide my land equally between them
I then do make & order David Andrews & Joseph Hart
