In the name of God amen the eighteenth day of May in the year of our lord 1769 I Thomas Barnes of Southampton county Virginia planter being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind memory thanks be given unto God do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner & form following Viz

Imprimis I give to my dearly beloved wife Martha all my stock of cattle & hogs together with my household furniture & accepting one bed and furniture which I give to my daughter Mary Barnes after the death of my said wife to be equally divided among my children

Item I give to my well beloved son Nathan Barnes whom together with my wife I herein ordain constitute and appoint executor of this my last will and testament all & singular my lands, messuages and tenements by him freely to be possessed & enjoyed In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & Year above written
