I give the labour of My two Negroes Vizt Robin and Nanny to my loving Wife Elisabeth during her Natural Life Also all my household Goods and Stock of all kinds after my just debts and funeral Expenses are paid

I give and Bequeath to my Son Samuel Phillips and to his heirs for ever My Negro Man Sam now in the Possession of my Father.

I give and bequeath to my Son Edwin Phillips and to his heirs for ever one Negro Boy Named Ben.

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Phillips and to her heirs for ever one Negro Boy Named Samson.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Phillips and to her heirs forever one Negro Boy named Peter.
