Will

In the name of God amen I Tho. Marks of parish of Norway in the County of Southampton being now of sound and disposing mind and memory thanks be to God do make and ordain this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made

Item

First. I give and devise unto my Daughter Mary the wife of Benja Braashan one Crown Current money of Virginia and no more of my Estate to shee nor none of of her heirs forever

I lend unto Elizabeth Spitty the sister of my Deceased wife my land whereon I now Live containing of two hundred and twenty acres be the same more or less my still pot worn and Cap my whole Stock of all kind my two Negroes Jack and Phillis and all my household furniture only one feather Bed and furniture to my Daughter Rebeckah the wife of Wm Mackey for Enduring of single life and if she marries she the said Elizabeth is to have no more to say to my Estate all

give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Honour the wife of Richard worrell at the Death or Marriage of Elizabeth Spitty before Mentioned my Negroe wench Phillis my still pot worn and Cap and to her heirs forever

Item

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Rebeckah the wife of William Mackey my plantation whereon I now Live with two hundred and twenty acres more or less adjoining the same and my Negroe fellow Jack — and one feather Bed and furniture to her and her heirs

Item

I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Margit the wife of William Doyl thirty five pound Cash Current money of Virginia and no more of my Estate all

I do hereby Direct that my exenter make sale one hundred acres of land lying joining on John Hastey William Spitty and the land formerly Robert mongers and that they convey the same in free simple to the purchaser or purchasers thereof and the money arising for the same to be Equally Divided between Richard worrell and William Mackey Likewise my will and Desire is that at my Death or Marriage of Elizabeth Spitty that my whole Stock of all kinds and all my household furniture to be Equally Divided between Richard Worrells and William Mackey

I do hereby appoint my two sons in Laid Richard worrell and will Mackey Executors of this my last will and testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the twentieth Day of April 1771
