 and State of Virginia, being of Sound mind and memory, but weak in body,
 wishing to make a disposition of my property to wit, do make and declare
 this to be my last will and Testament, revoking all former Wills heretofore
 made by me. I desire my just debts to be paid, and burying expenses
 to be paid out of my Estate 1st I leave to my Daughter Fannie Bond
 and two Children Sally A. Bond Lirtus Bond and my Daughter Almira
 Spivey to have & hold and have so long as my Daughters Fannie
 Bond and Almira Spivey live a single life, together with my
 Chattel Estate and I desire that Fannie Spivey shall be authorized to
 live and manage and take care of my Daughters so long as they live a
 single life. 2nd I give to my Daughter Almira Spivey a small Slave
 named as known by the Lucinda Spivey and to her and her heirs
 forever. 3rd I give to my Daughter Sally A. Bond one good feather
 Bed, furniture to her and her heirs forever. After the death
 or intermarriage of my Daughters Fannie Bond & Almira Spivey
 should take place, I desire my Executor make sale of my Lands
 and Chattel Estate and equally divide between my six Grand-
 children (namely) Sally A. Bond, Lirtus Bond, Robert Spivey, Almira
 Spivey, J. P. Spivey & James G. Spivey to them and their heirs
 forever. I desire that Sugars Cain be my Executor without bond,
 whereby I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
 to the above writing this 24th day of April one thousand
 Eight hundred and Seventy four.
