

that my estate as heretofore bequeathed her together with the increase of negroes and stock as then existing be equally divided between the three children of my dear brother, Levi Hurdley, namely Richard, Seonidas and Tharsha.

Further: In the event of the death of either of the above named children before it arrives to lawful age, then in that event the other or others to have that one, proportion "as heretofore given" after deducting what has been spent by the Guardian for the education and support of the said one.

Lastly and lastly. I constitute my beloved wife my Executrix to this my last will and testament her testimony whereof I have set my hand and seal this 20th day of July one thousand eight hundred and sixty one.
