 2^d As the worth of the share of either of my minor Children without Body heirs that the property devised to such child to be equally divided among the remaining Children mentioned in this Will above or their Body heirs.
 3^d I have given my Grandson James Elliott. I give nothing in this Will, because I have already given his Father the share intended for him.
 4^d I have receipts for money advanced to a portion of my Children which receipts are to be credited as a portion of my personal estate. But there shall be no account of interest accounted for the said receipts.
 5th I leave all my Real Estate to be disposed of by my son Thos. Judkins and son in law James S. Barham as they may deem best, preferring however it should be sold should the times warrant it.
 6. I leave my son William H. Judkins sole Executor of this my last Will and desire him to qualify as guardian of my minor Children Jno. S. and Aristatus Judkins April the tenth eighteen hundred and twenty two.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on Monday the 19th day of April 1875 The last Will and Testament of James H. Judkins, was proved by the oaths of Joshua Priles and Drumick Beale, the two subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. The Executor therein named being dead, and the motion of Margaret Judkins the widow of the Testator who made oath according to law and together with J. J. Porton and J. D. Priles, her securities, (who justified on Oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Eight Thousand Dollars, Conditioned as the law directs, which bond is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted the said Margaret Judkins for obtaining letters of administration on the Estate of the said James H. Judkins with the will annexed in due form.
