I Alexander Smith of the County of Southampton in the State of Va. do hereby make this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say,
 1st I give that my Executor at suitable time after my death sell all of my Estate that I shall not otherwise dispose of and out of the proceeds thereof together with what I may have coming to me pay all my just debts and expenses.
 2^d I give and bequeath to my son James I. Smith the sum of twenty five dollars to be paid to him at the discretion of my Executor.
 3^d I give to Mary Smith spouse of my son James I. Smith during her life or as long as she is the wife a portion of said James I. Smith for the use of herself and children the following James property to wit, all the Land & premises I now own, all my Servant Slaves I now have and those hereafter, my Horse, Wagon, by means of which I now drive Coal, & Coal Cart, my Apple Tree, half my stock of sheep, four cows and pigs or some of the pigs One Cart & for & wheat, my hedges and barns, a sufficient quantity of working tools for the family and farm and as much of my household and kitchen furniture as said Mary Smith may need for the use of herself & family my brand of Salt, Apples, Peaches, &c. I also give and bequeath to said Mary Smith a sufficient portion of provisions and fuel of all kinds that I may have in hand at my death for the support of herself & family and stock thing I wish until the expiration and harvesting the ensuing crop & to be set apart by the appraisers of my Estate, and at the death or in the death the said Mary Smith should become the widow of James I. Smith and in that event give to Mary I. Smith that my Executor in take possession immediately of all the property that remains that is due to the said Mary Smith as specified in this my third section of my will and at such time and terms as my Executor may think proper sell all the Land & Slaves and all the property that belongs to the said Mary Smith reserving in the selling or selling to my son James I. Smith the use of my Horse, Wagon, and all the household & kitchen furniture and the right of way from said yard to the public road during his life and he will consent for his privilege lived to him to be sold with the other stock for the benefit of his children.
