

In a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 17th day of January 1876
 the last Will and Testament of Christopher D. Bartlam, was proved by the Testimony of David H.
 Hinckley, Justice of Peace. The Interrogatory questions were, and were to be recorded
 and in the opinion of Master of Probate, the Testimony therein given, was made out
 according to law and intent and acknowledged a true and the penalty to
 be imposed Dollars, but without Security (the will directing whom to be taken, and the
 Court requiring none,) which sum is believed to be recorded.
 Certificate is granted the said Master of Probate for obtaining a copy of the said
 Will in due form.

In the Name of God, amen, I, Christopher Bartlam, of the County of Southampton, in State of Virginia, do hereby make and publish this my Will and Testament, in manner and form following, that is to say—

Item 1st, After my decease, I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my Estate, also for a roof to be placed over my grave, and also a seat and roof to be placed over the grave of my deceased Husband Christopher Martin Vick,
 and also a Roof to be placed over my dead Daughter Caroline Vick's Grave,
 out of my Estate.

Item 2^d, I give and bequeath to my Daughter, Mary Ann Vick, one Teacher Bed
 and Head, and the fourth part in Value of all my Bed clothes or Covers and
 an Offset.

Item 3rd, I give and bequeath to my Daughter, Martha J. Pope, one Teacher Bed and
 Head and the fourth part in Value of all my Bed clothes or Covers and
 my largest Walnut Table and Cabinet.

Item 4th, I give and bequeath to my Daughter, Sally C. Ferguson, my Side board
 and Hutch, two Pitchers, two Decanters, two Glasses and Water?

Item 5th, I give and bequeath to the children of my deceased Daughter, Ann
 C. Ferguson, wife of Henry D. Ferguson, one dollar, only, to them to
 be equally divided amongst them, and the rest?

Item 6th, I loan to my Daughter Caroline V. Jones during her life, one
 Teacher Bed and Head and the fourth part in Value of all my
 Bed clothes or Covers, one Dining Table and Hutch and Looking Glass,
 my but Chest and one Green Slip Boat, and at her death her share
 of my property I give to her child or children of the living and, but if they
 die before me and by age or marriage, then that portion of you to be
 equally divided between Mary Ann Vick, Martha J. Pope and Sally
 C. Ferguson in their living, or if Capt. V. Jones (her grand son) die
 without any child, I give her portion to be equally divided between
 my three Daughters just named in this item.

Item 7th, I give and bequeath the balance of my Estate to be equally divided between
 my four Daughters, Mary Ann Vick, Martha J. Pope and Sally C.
 Ferguson and Caroline V. Jones, Mrs Jones (widow) to receive as long
 as she the 6th item.

Item 8th, And lastly, I hereby nominate and appoint my friend Doctor
 O. Gray, Executor of this my last Will and Testament, recording and
 amending all other Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made, in
 witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
